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#### **Other Requirements:**

The courses listed on the preceding pages fulfill the requirements of an associate degree at CEI. Completion confers the following benefits:

- 1) ISU waives the Univeristy application and admission fee.
- ISUaccepts completion of predetermined CEI courses for the ISU bachelor's degree. Students who
  transfer without predetermined courses must complete ISU's institution- specific education
  requirements.

#### **College of Eastern IdahoProgram Requirements:**

Students who are seeking an Associate of Applied Science in Registered Nursing (RN) must complete no fewer than 25% of their credit requirements through CEI. Students do not automatically have their degrees conferred, a graduation application must be submitted and fees paid. Once a review has been completed by the Registrar's Office showing completion of all graduation requirements, then will the student record be conferred. Students must earn a minimum grade of 'C' in all pre-requisites and required RN courses. In addition, a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher is required for graduation.

#### **Idaho State University Requirements:**

Students must complete 120 credits of coursework, of which at least 60 must be academic credits. Completion of an AA/AS /AAS degree from CEI satisfies ISU's general education requirements. Students must complete 36 credits of upper division coursework (3000 level and above), of which 15 must be earned at ISU. At least 30 credits in the major area of study must be resident credits (earned at ISU), or 30 of the last 50 credits applied to the degree must be ISU resident credit. Refer to the ISU catalog for limits on specialized credits such as credit by exam, physical activity, music participation, and experiential learning. Students must complete all major requirements with a minimum grade point average of 2.0 and have an overall ISU cumulative GPA of 2.0.

### **ISU Program-Specific Notes:**

NURS 4400 Experiential Learning Equivalency for BS Completion Students (all NURS 4400 must be pre-approved by faculty advisor with specific goals for completion of the experiential credit documented and on record as the student progresses in the program).

NURS 4491 Independent Study in Nursing (must have Independent Study contract pre-approved by instructor or faculty advisor for any NURS 4491 credit, and record of completion of contract goals documented by faculty advisor in student record). All students must be enrolled in the BS completion program through the School of Nursing in order to register for NURS prefix courses. Professional fees apply.
