- I. President – President Watts reported that this past Monday, January 15th she spoke at the Martin Luther King Jr. Day Celebration along with Director Whitney. This was a student centric event that had around 150-200 students in attendance and was a very positive event. President Watts also shared that she has been participating in an Instagram takeover today.
- II. SAB Director – SAB Director Morgan shared that the January Bingo event has been rescheduled to January 30th. Today was Bengal Wednesday for the month of January. For the rest of the month there will be a Glass Painting event, Trivia Night and Gatsby all coming up. Director Morgan also shared that for a future event in March, Spring Fest, SAB may need some help from ASISU with this event.
- III. Vice President – Vice President Reynolds shared that he is finalizing the gear order design. Once this is finalized he will share the design with the Cabinet to get their preferences.

Director Whitney has been reaching out to other students and individuals to join this committee. Director Whitney also shared that she has reapplied for the Condoms Collective, we should receive his shipment in around three weeks. In regards to this she is going to meet with campus housing and the RAs to gauge how the condoms were received in housing around campus.
