- President President Watts shared that from members who are attending COSGA if there is still interest in presenting, please fill out the form regarding a presenting topic by February 16<sup>th</sup> for priority application status. The final deadline for submission is on March 25<sup>th</sup>. President Watts asked member stop please collaborate for this submission to ensure we are not entering submissions for the same topics. President Watts attended leadership council this morning where they discussed the black student athlete club being implemented. They also discussed that there are two university committees being implemented, starting in February and March of this year and will continue through the fall 2024 semester. They are asking for two student representatives, one for each committee. One of these committees is all about campus events and incorporating a student voice and perspective for campus events. The other committee is focused on the operating and financial structures of ISU. President Watts also shared that FAFS is being reorganized and will not be presented until mid-March with the release of institutional student aid records. She also shared the key updates that are being made to the 2024-2025 FAFSA. Overall the changes being made to FAFSA are not good and take away more money from students than they granted. President Watts shared the idea of including FAFSA registration at the ROAR Into Registration events to aid new students in registering in this new and more difficult system.

She also shared that their Cupid Carnival was a successful event with over 150 students in attendance. The upcoming events include Casino Night on February 13<sup>th</sup>, Game Fest on the 15<sup>th</sup>, Bingo on the 20<sup>th</sup> and Bengal Wednesday on the 21<sup>st</sup>.
