

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (Ph.D) IN COUNSELOR EDUCATION AND COUNSELING

Recipients of the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) in Counselor Education and Counseling must have demonstrated the ability to teach counseling-related subjects, core, and specialty; provide clinical supervision; conduct research and program evaluation relevant to the work setting; deliver individual, group, and/or couple and family counseling; and provide consultation services. Graduates are prepared to be counselor educators, supervisors, and counselors, but may also function as supervisors in university, mental health, and family counseling centers.

A. **General Residency Requirement:** Following the bachelor's degree, each candidate must complete the equivalent of ten semesters of graduate study including the master's specialty practice area and three years of doctoral residency. At least six of the semesters must be at the doctoral level and three must be consecutive semesters of full-time graduate study on campus. (It is strongly recommended that the student attend all six of these semesters on a full-time basis.)
