






Dorsal Fin














- Helps fish turn and keep upright when turning abruptly

Rounded - Burbot





Square - Flathead Catfish

Caudal Fin


- Give power to propel fish through water
- Acts like rudder to help fish steer
- Forked tail is the fastest, rounded the slowest

Pelvic Fin











- Help balance the fish
- Keep fish level and prevent it from rolling
- Fish sometimes rest by sitting on their pelvic fins

Pectoral Fin











- Help steer and control depth
- Often have a wrist-like function
- Offer maneuverability

Adipose Fin





- Found on members of the salmon and catfish families
 Believed to help reduce drag and improve swimming
